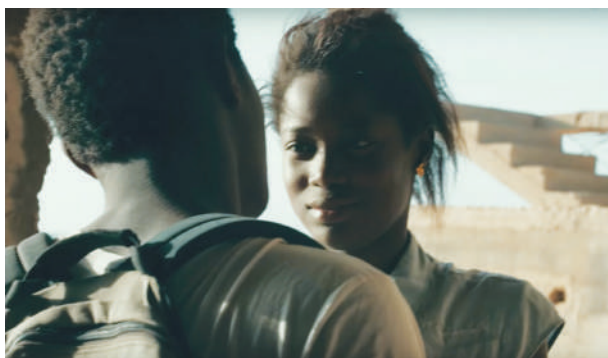


Atlantics

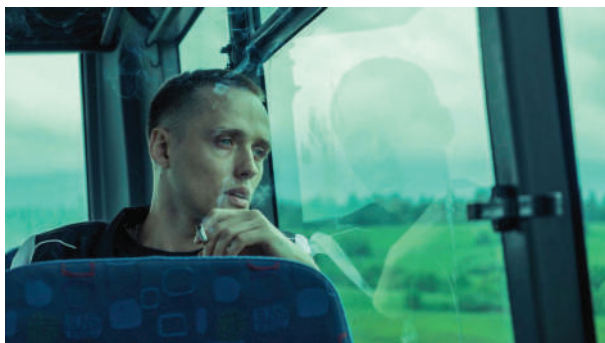


Corpus Christi
